Resolutions on Wake (ballast) Boats: In recognizing the adverse impact of wake boats, when operating with full water ballast tanks, upon shoreline structures such as floats and docks, and the damage to shoreline erosion the following votes are requested.

For Halfmoon Lake:

All wakeboarding boats, while using internal water ballast tanks and/or wake forming external wake gates, (where by increasing their wave height) shall limit their use to the main body of the lake, (between Proctors point and Fernhill beach) while maintaining a minimum of 300 feet from other boats, docks or the shore line.

For the State of New Hampshire, HMLA recommends legislative or agency rulemaking as follows:

All wakeboarding boats, while using internal water ballast tanks and/or wake forming external wake gates, (where by increasing their wave height) shall limit their use beyond 300 feet from other boats, docks, or shoreline; also, such boating activity should be prohibited beyond a 1000-foot point-to-point area as to prevent use in narrow bays and coves.
