

ALTON-BARNSTEAD HALF MOON LAKE ASSOCIATION

SECRETARY'S REPORT - JULY 10, 1983

The first meeting of the 1983 season of the Alton-Barnstead Half Moon Lake Association was held on Sunday, July 10, in Frank Brewster's cottage. The meeting was called to order by President John Marmaras at 10:10 a.m. Attending were: John Alliegro, Edward Blair, Frank Brewster, Arthur Gilbert, Elvia Hetu, Larry Holt, Wally Lubelazyh, John Marmaras, Paul Munchback, and James Parrish.

The secretary's report of the August 29, 1982 meeting was read and accepted. The treasurer's report, which gave a balance on hand of \$1578.76 as of July 9, 1983, was also accepted.

Art Gilbert reported that Jean LeBlanc, chairman of the Ski Contest, who was unable to attend the meeting, had obtained approval from the State of New Hampshire to hold the Water Ski Contest, Canoe and Sailboat Races on Saturday, August 6, with a rain date of Sunday, August 7. On a motion by Art Gilbert, seconded by John Alliegro, it was voted unanimously to authorize \$100.00 for the expenses of these 1983 races.

Larry Holt volunteered to take charge of the Labor Day weekend Boat Parade to be held on Saturday, September 3, 1983, with a rain date of September 4. Frank Brewster reported that he had already purchased some 15-minute flares for the parade. Larry Holt said that he would obtain the remaining flares and would try to get the 30-minute flares recommended by Art Gilbert and Ed Blair.

John Marmaras volunteered to obtain the specific container to take a sample of the water from the public spring and to have the water tested in Concord.

Under old business, John Alliegro read letters and Ed Blair

presented documents to bring those present at the meeting up to date on what was being done regarding the use of Kent Locke's field as an airport.

In 1972 Kent Locke applied to the Planning Board and/or Zoning Board of Adjustment of the Town of Barnstead for permission to operate an airplane landing field on his real estate. No such permission was granted and Mr. Locke filed no appeal of such denial. At the request of our Association on August 11, 1975 the Planning Board sent Kent Locke an order to cease and desist in the use of his field as an airstrip.

Following the accident in the field on August 8, 1982 members of our Association attended the Board of Selectmen's meeting in Barnstead on August 22, 1982 and later wrote to the Board requesting that something be done and that we be kept informed of the progress on this matter.

On September 28, 1982 the Board of Selectmen instructed Kent Locke to remove all aircraft and related equipment from his field by October 15, 1982 and cease to use the field as an airstrip. They notified him that they would inspect the site on that date and that failure to comply would result in prosecution. Selectman Paul A. Golden visited the field at 8:15 a.m. on October 15, 1982 and found five airplanes parked there.

On September 28, 1982 a Petition for Injunction was drawn up and signed by Selectman Leonard S. Tasker. The Town of Barnstead's lawyer, Attorney McManus of Dover, who postponed the original court date on this matter, due to a conflict in his calendar, is still studying the matter.

After a lengthy discussion on the problem, President Marmaras

appointed a committee to investigate the matter further. On the committee are John Alliegro, Chairman; Edward Blair, Art Gilbert, Jim Parrish and Mary Ross. Mr. Marmaras stated that he would write to the Town of Barnstead informing the Selectmen that the Association had appointed a committee to work on the airstrip problem.

Wally Lubelazyh, Assistant Director of Camp MiTeNa, reported that the camp had not tested the lake water yet this year, but he agreed to furnish the Association through Frank Brewster, with any testing results the camp obtains.

An effort is still being made to update a list of all the property owners on Half Moon Lake, and Mr. Marmaras volunteered to remake the map of all the residents on the lake which Jim Parrish prepared a few years ago.

Jim Parrish suggested that the best way to keep an up-to-date list of names and addresses was for the Area Representatives to deliver an Association Letter to each household at the beginning of each season and to mail a letter to each member at the close of each season, retaining those returned by the post office as "undeliverable" for the Area Representatives to obtain new correct addresses from the members at the beginning of the following season.

Following a motion by John Alliegro, seconded by Art Gilbert, the meeting was adjourned at 11:40 a.m. until the next meeting on Sunday, August 21.
