

THE ALTON-BARNSTEAD HALF MOON LAKE ASSOCIATION'S

SECRETARY'S REPORT FOR AUGUST 18, 1985

The August 18, 1985 meeting of the Alton-Barnstead Half Moon Lake Association was held at Frank Brewster's cottage. In the absence of the president, Vice President John Alliegro called the meeting to order at 10:15 a.m. Present were: John Alliegro, Frank Brewster, Elvia Hetu, and Donald Sheldon.

The Secretary's report of the July 14, 1985 meeting was read and accepted.

The Treasurer's report, showing a balance of \$2031.31 as of August 17, 1985, was read and accepted.

Under old business, Frank Brewster reported that the water at the public spring which had been tested was found to be in bad condition and that the state testers advised not to drink it. Mr. Brewster said that he would arrange to have the area around the spring raked out to allow the surface water to drain off which would perhaps alleviate the problem.

No "No Swimming" sign was posted at the public beach in 1985, but Mr. Brewster agreed to have one posted by Memorial Day of 1986.

Mr. Brewster reported that he had spoken to Richard Hedley, owner of Fern Hill, about the problem caused by the Fern Hill ski boats in the Rustic Shores area and hoped that the situation had been cleared up.

Mr. Brewster also reported that he had arranged to have Mr. Rosco Tasker repair the boat ramp next to Hernden's house where a piece of the road had eroded, that the work had been completed, and paid for.

Under new business, Mr. Alliegro announced that due to the lack of a quorum the election of officers scheduled for this meeting would have to be postponed until the next meeting, July 13, 1986. He expressed his disappointment at the small number of members in attendance because, since the Association was for the benefit of every family on the lake, it was important that everyone be represented and informed of what takes place at the meetings. Mr. Alliegro agreed to prepare a newsletter to be distributed to all families on the lake the following weekend, informing them of the boat parade on Saturday, August 31, with a raindate of Sunday, September 1, and urging them to attend our next meeting. Mr. Brewster agreed to secure 65-70 flares for the parade.

The meeting adjourned at 10:55 a.m. on a motion by Frank Brewster, seconded by Donald Sheldon.
